VICTORIAN FIRES

As we all know, Victoria has been devastated by the worst bushfires in our history. This has resulted in the death of many horses and livestock through out the affected areas. The one thing that became clear after the first couple of days were that there was a huge need for horse feed and supplies for the remaining horses. SA farrier Paul Scragg rang me and said that he had organized through networks in SA some trucks full of hay and other supplies to be delivered to the fire affected areas and would I co-ordinate the relief effort from the Victorian side.

Fortunately in times of great need it brings out the best in most people, however it brings out the worst in some.

It became evident that no government authorities in Victoria had provided adequately for the horse population. The Victorian Farmers Federation was only interested in sheep and cattle and other groups such as RSPCA were more concerned about blue crested wombats and the like. So we took things into our own hands and through a network of people that only a farrier and horse dentist could put together, we, with the help of 5 exceptional people delivered 400 large bales and 4000 small bales of hay, 1500 bags of chaff and hard feed, and numerous supplies such as medical, rugs, fly veils, head collars etc to 5 locations in and around the affected areas. Places such as Alexandra, Buxton, Whittlesea, Colbinane and Pakenham. It was an extraordinary effort by all people concerned and the support from the National body and President, Bob Sim was greatly appreciated.

However far more disappointing was the lack of preparation and non-existence of a disaster plan by the governing authorities the likes of the DPI, whom, since the recent EI outbreak have done little or nothing to protect the horse community as a whole.

After going to many meetings since the fires, I, and others in the horse community are pushing for more to be done to protect the animals and people of whom our industry relies upon.

Hopefully we will never see an event of this magnitude again, however in the event that we do, now is the time for us to step up and protect the horses so that they do not slip through beauracratc gaps such as happened on this occasion.

Presently we are working with the horse council and Government departments to address these issues. One thing that would be of great help would be a service provider and industry user database text system for communication. Such system is already in existence but operates on a voluntary enrolment basis only. I will keep you up to date as we progress.

The Tree Project

The Australian Blacksmiths Association (Victoria) Inc. is asking blacksmiths worldwide to help us create a forged gumtree as a memorial to the people who lost their lives, to honour the tireless people who defended others and to stand as a symbol of regeneration for the survivors. The ABA (Vic) Blacksmiths will undertake to forge the trunk and branches of the tree and attach each leaf. The tree will be installed in a public place in one of the affected townships.

What you need to do:

Forge a gum leaf in stainless steel or copper following the specifications below. If you wish, you may forge a complete branch, a twig with a few leaves or some gumnuts. All contributions will be gratefully received. Please send your finished leaves and your details to:

Specifications

Leaves need to be made of stainless steel or copper. Actual gum leaves vary in length from around 60mm (2 ½”) to over 250mm (10”) and are long and flat. The larger leaves are generally no wider than 40mm (1 ½”) at their widest point. Characteristically, the leaves hang down. If you wish, you may like to forge a gumnut. Gumnuts are rounded and hollow. Although there are varieties of large gumnuts, they are generally no larger than a thumbnail.) Ideally, the forged leaves can be about 1–2mm (1/16”) thick. Stems need to be at least 6mm (¼”) thick, no less and at least 50mm (2”) long. As one Australian blacksmith puts it; *“Folks, you have to realise that us Aussies are all descended from a bunch of thieving convicts. If you feel your design is going to go walkabout or fall off at the first gust of wind perhaps the design needs reconsidering.”* So please don’t make your leaf stems too thin, or your leaf may well become a trophy for a local vandal. Please note, that these are guidelines only and we do not want 1000 exact copies of the same leaf! Each leaf will be as individual as the ‘smith that created it. If you have one, we ask that you put your touchmark on your leaves, or at least mark it in some way so we can identify your work and mark your contribution.

Thank you for your efforts in helping us build a lasting memorial.
